The Editor Signs Off...

In transferring the editorial function and responsibility from one man to another. I suppose it is inevitable that some loose ends will go undiscovered and be lost. I have discovered that in the assumption of that editorial function and responsibility I inadvertantly overlooked some "loose ends" in the form of some items for The Forensic. As I went through files passed on to me by John Randolph I found a file containing several articles as well as chapter notes and alumni news. Since I didn't find this material until after the October issue had been printed and since much of it had to do with tournaments and events of last spring, I will not be able to use it now, but I want those chapters involved to know that the oversight was not deliberate.
