



We are most fortunate to have this famous gentleman in our church and at Ottawa University these two days. Dr. Ligon is Professor of Psychology at Union College at Schenectady, New York and is Director of the Union College Character Research project.

Dr. Ligon will speak three times in our church on October 30. He will speak to our Sunday Church School staff at three o'clock and at four he will speak to our teenagers and their parents on "Learning Through a Partnership." At 7:15 p.m. he will speak in our mid-week service on "Spiritual Growth in the Home" and this will be followed by an informal discussion. Dr. Ligon will also speak in the chapel at Ottawa University at eleven o'clock on Friday. Many of our people, especially teachers and parents, should plan now to attend these valuable sessions with Dr. Ligon.
