## PI KAPPA DELTA MEMBER STUDYING ABROAD ON ROTARY FELLOWSHIP

**David P. Lauerman** of Mascoutah, Illinois, a member of Pi Kappa Delta at Millikin University, Decatur, Illinois, is one of 137 outstanding graduate students from 35 countries studying abroad on Rotary Foundation Fellowships during the 1962-63 academic year. The Fellowships are awarded by Rotary International, world-wide service organization.

Called Rotary Foundation Fellowships for International Understanding, these study grants are a part of a global program to help further understanding and friendly relations among people of different nations. Since 1947, when the Fellowship program was inaugurated, 1,728 awards have been granted at a cost of nearly \$4.5 million.

Lauerman, whose application for the fellowship was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Mascoutah, is studying history and political science at Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand, in preparation for a career in the U. S. Foreign Service.

A 1961 recipient of the bachelor of arts



degree at Millikin University, Lauerman was on the Dean's List and received WCIA-TV and WTVP-TV awards. He was also elected to *Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges*.

He was president of Pi Kappa Delta, Alpha Epsilon Rho, a national radio fraternity, and Delta Sigma Phi, social fraternity. He held membership in Phi Chi Alpha, a local men's honor society, and was sports editor of the school newspaper. During 1960-61 he was sports director and radio and television announcer for the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company.

Events included Varsity and Novice Debate, Extempore Speaking, and Oral Interpretation of prose and poetry.

Members of the Missouri Kappa chapter of PKD with other members of the squad participated in the Discussion Conference at Nebraska Wesleyan and debate tournaments at University of Missouri, Iowa State University, Northeast Missouri State Teachers College at Kirksville, Nebraska State Teachers College at Wayne, and Illinois State Normal University this past semester. A debate before the local chapter of AAUP on the national question, followed by critiques by Economics Professor Earl Bragdon and Forensics Director George Hinshaw, was a January highlight. In addition to tournament participation, plans (including, of course, the Pi Kap Golden Convention at Southern Illinois) for second semester include debates before community and civic groups and the possibility of meeting the debaters from Scotland.

## *In Memoriam:* *Dana T. Burns*

With deep regret THE FORENSIC announces that Professor Dana T. Burns, formerly chairman of the department of speech at Baldwin-Wallace College, died in Cleveland, September 28, 1962. Professor Burns was known and loved by many in Pi Kappa Delta, and THE FORENSIC joins his friends and admirers in paying tribute to his great contribution to speech in general and to Pi Kappa Delta in particular.

Ohio Alpha Chapter of Pi Kappa Delta was organized at Baldwin-Wallace College in April of 1921. Mr. Burns came to Baldwin-Wallace in the Fall of that same year as an instructor in Speech and English. At the end of the academic year, the president asked the Board of Trustees to establish a Department of Speech with Mr. Burns as the Chairman. Mrs. Burns came to Baldwin-Wallace in February of 1942 as instructor in Speech and English. Together, they developed the department into a thirty-three course department with special emphasis on a forensic program.

Mr. Burns held several important offices. Twice he was Governor of the Province of the Lakes. He was assistant editor of THE FORENSIC under the late Dr. Russfield. Mr. Burns established the Northeastern Ohio Debate Conference (NEODC). He was President of Ohio Association of College Teachers of Speech (OACTS).

The records show that Mr. and Mrs. Burns attended all national conventions up to the one held at Estes Park, and all Province Conventions were attended without exception.

Mr. Burns established the Great Lakes Debate Tournament, which is still operating, and was the author of a book on oral interpretation.

Mr. Burns was co-chairman with H. Dana Hopkins and John Smith in arranging for entertaining students and conducting contests at Otterbein College and Baldwin-Wallace the year the National Convention held its final events at Heidelberg University.

Mr. Burns' first oratorical success was Carl England, now Chairman of the Department of Speech at Dartmouth College. His second outstanding orator was James Sivard, who won the National Peace Contest in 1927.

Other outstanding orators were Reverend Lawrence Stone, Attorney Stanley Toliver, Reverend James Lawson, and Mr. Charles Irwin, who later became Chairman of the Department of Speech at Baldwin-Wallace College and is a nationally known speaker and educator.

One compliment of Mr. Burns' great efforts at the college which appeared to be the fondest in his memory was stated by President Albert B. Storms, "Mr. Burns brought order out of chaos." Let us not forget that men like Dana Burns brought the entire field of Speech out of Chaos.
