In Memoriam: Dana T. Burns

With deep regret The Forensic announces that Professor Dana T. Burns, formerly chairman of the department of speech at Baldwin-Wallace College, died in Cleveland, September 28, 1962. Professor Burns was known and loved by many in Pi Kappa Delta, and The Forensic joins his friends and admirers in paying tribute to his great contribution to speech in general and to

Pi Kappa Delta in particular.

Ohio Alpha Chapter of Pi Kappa Delta was organized at Baldwin-Wallace College in April of 1921. Mr. Burns came to Baldwin-Wallace in the Fall of that same year as an instructor in Speech and English. At the end of the academic year, the president asked the Board of Trustees to establish a Department of Speech with Mr. Burns as the Chairman. Mrs. Burns came to Baldwin-Wallace in February of 1942 as instructor in Speech and English. Together, they developed the department into a thirty-three course department with special emphasis on a forensic program.

Mr. Burns held several important offices. Twice he was Governor of the Province of the Lakes. He was assistant editor of The Forensic under the late Dr. Russfield. Mr. Burns established the Northeastern Ohio Debate Conference (NEODC). He was President of Ohio Association of College

Teachers of Speech (OACTS).

The records show that Mr. and Mrs. Burns attended all national conventions up to the one held at Estes Park, and all Province Conventions were attended without exception.

Mr. Burns established the Great Lakes Debate Tournament, which is still operating, and was the author of a book on oral

interpretation.

Mr. Burns was co-chairman with H. Dana Hopkins and John Smith in arranging for entertaining students and conducting contests at Otterbein College and Baldwin-Wallace the year the National Convention held its final events at Heidelberg University.

Mr. Burns' first oratorical success was Carl England, now Chairman of the Department of Speech at Dartmouth College. His second outstanding orator was James Sivard, who won the National Peace Contest in 1927.

Other outstanding orators were Reverend Lawrence Stone, Attorney Stanley Toliver, Reverend James Lawson, and Mr. Charles Irwin, who later became Chairman of the Department of Speech at Baldwin-Wallace College and is a nationally known speaker and educator.

One compliment of Mr. Burns' great efforts at the college which appeared to be the fondest in his memory was stated by President Albert B. Storms, "Mr. Burns brought order out of chaos." Let us not forget that men like Dana Burns brought the entire field of Speech out of Chaos.
