


College Choice a Real Problem, Says Prexy

Dr. A. B. Martin says in the November issue of THE BAPTIST LEADER, that the choice of a college or university poses a real problem for the prospective stu-

dent. "The decision should not be a hasty one. It should be made in the light of facts about the student himself and the institution to which he is attracted," commented Prexy, in an article entitled "Invitation to Christian Learning."

Also listed by the President of O. U., were characteristics of the Christian college. It must be a normal community, he said, with sound courses of study and the activities of healthy campus life. Its Christian purpose must be understood and accepted. Its work in this area must not be confined to the department of religion, even though that must be a strong division of the college curriculum. Christian attitudes and atmosphere on the campus must be prevalent.

He also made significant comments about teaching in a Christian college, "The teacher is a particular department is expected first of all to deal with the materials in his subject field and not make his



lectures an excuse for propagandizing religion. However he should not hesitate to present religious implications of the subject when it seems appropriate and logical to do so."
