

The Rev. Leonard Hobart Pillsbury, 80

Chaplain in WWII; served
in churches on East Coast

CRAIGVILLE — The Rev. Leonard Hobart Pillsbury, 80, died Wednesday at his home.

He was the husband of Louise (Andrews) Pillsbury.

Mr. Pillsbury was born in Derry, N.H. He graduated from the University of New Hampshire in 1938 and Andover Newton Theological School in 1941.

He served as an Army chaplain during World War II, serving in Okinawa and Korea with the 375th Station Hospital.

Mr. Pillsbury served in Congregational churches in Connecticut, Vermont, Massachusetts and in the Rochester, N.Y. area. He retired in 1987 and moved to the Craigville section of Barnstable, where he had been a longtime summer

resident.

Mr. Pillsbury was active in community affairs and was involved in seeking housing for elderly people and support for people with mental illness.

He was a member of the board of Christian Camp Meeting in Craigville.

Surviving besides his wife are two sons, Stephen L. Pillsbury of Avon, Conn., and David A. Pillsbury of Newington, Conn.; a brother, Everett Pillsbury of Sarasota, Fla.; a sister, Louise Ross of Brooklyn, Conn.; and four grandchildren.

A memorial service will be at 2 p.m. tomorrow in The Tabernacle in Craigville.
