



The NAIA Football Championship

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics at over 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenent of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and organizational structure of the Association.

HISTORY AND PURPOSE

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the NAIA emanated from a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Missouri. The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the organization expanded beyond basketball and added national championship events in golf, outdoor track and field and tennis. Football, cross country, baseball and swimming were added to the championship event calendar in 1956, and wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962-78), gymnastics (1964), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968) and volleyball (1969-1980) were later additions.

Of major significance to the NAIA, was the establishment of the women's division within the Association on August 1, 1980. The NAIA decision to offer competitive opportunities and championships in women's athletics was passed by the membership following two years of study and proposals by an ad hoc committee on the implementation of a women's division into the NAIA structure. Currently, the Association conducts ten championship event programs for women in the sports of basketball, cross country, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, softball (fast pitch), soccer, swimming, tennis and volleyball.

The initial purpose of the NAIA — to provide national championship athletic opportunities to institutions below the so-called "major" level — has indeed been well served. The Association clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletics program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the institution. This means direct supervision in caliber of competition, financing of the program and taking steps to assure that financial assistance is made available only through the institution and under the same general policies as aid to all students. In short, the basic premise is that the athletics program is a basic component of the overall educational process and not an entity part.

ADMINISTRATION

The governing body of the NAIA is the National Executive Committee, composed of 10 persons elected by the membership. The Executive Committee is responsible for establishing the policies and determining the overall direction of the Association. The Executive Committee hires the Executive Director, who conducts the business and day-to-day operation of the National Office headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri.

The District is the basic unit of the NAIA. The Association is organized into 31 geographical districts spread over the 50 states and a part of Canada. Each District is governed by a District Executive Committee, the chief officer of which is the District Chair. The District Executive Committee establishes a program of championship events in various sports and individual/team champions of those district events are qualified to compete in NAIA Area and National Championship competition.

Eligibility rules within the NAIA govern all play in all sports recognized by the Association, not just post-season play. All eligibility guidelines must be adhered to by all members, including those holding dual affiliation with other associations. Certification of eligibility of all NAIA student/athletes is accomplished through a network of individuals which includes the faculty athletic representative of each institution, the District Eligibility Chair and the National Eligibility Committee.

MEMBERSHIP

Any four-year college or university and upper-level two-year institution in the United States and Canada which awards the bachelor's degree or equivalent, may hold active NAIA membership. Active member institutions must be fully accredited by an appropriate accrediting agency or commission.

OBLIGATION OR MEMBERSHIP

Member institutions must conduct their intercollegiate athletic programs with the standards of the regulatory Associations in which they hold membership, and the NAIA. They must pay their annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the NAIA. Where institutional rules and standards are stricter than those of the regulatory group or the NAIA, those rules and standards of the institution are recognized and supported by the NAIA.

The Braves' recent move to the KCAC has increased their statewide coverage, as they have made their mark in major area newspapers such as the Topeka Capital-Journal, the Wichita Eagle/Beacon, and the Kansas City Star/Times.







Head Coach Glenn Percy

Glenn Percy is starting his second year as head football coach of the Ottawa University Braves' football team. Percy gained considerable respect in the KCAC last year by posting a fourth place conference record of 5-4, and completing the season with an overall 5-5 record.

Percy came to the University last year after two years as head coach at Wichita West High School. After receiving his BA in education from Washburn University in 1956, Percy's first coaching assignment was in Pleasanton, Kansas. In addition to Pleasanton, he has coached in Kingman, Coffeyville, Hutchinson, Prairie Village and Ponca City, Oklahoma.

In 1978 Percy was selected to coach the East Team for the annual East-West Kansas Shrine Bowl which the East won 34-0. In the summer of 1978 he was selected as the head coach of the Kansas team for the annual Big Brother Bowl played at Arrowhead Stadium. His team won 34-6. Percy's overall coaching record is 118 wins, 94 losses and 5 ties.

COACH PERCY'S OUTLOOK FOR 1985

Glenn Percy is hoping that the combination of 32 returning players, in conjunction with about 40 new recruits and transfers will help the Braves improve on their .500 season last year. The Braves are also looking to better their respectable 5-4 record in KCAC Conference play.

Percy feels that his recruiting was successful, and hopes that the new additions will help fill the gaps created by key players that graduated. Two seniors that Percy is especially counting on for a successful season include receiver Tim Boyd and running back Eric Stephens.

The defensive line is the area that has Percy most concerned. "We lost almost everyone off that line to graduation, but we're hoping to get some big boys in there to do the job." Senior Mark Jackson is the only returnee from last year's defensive line.

Percy feels strongly about his defensive backfield. "We'll have our entire starting defensive backfield back, and we feel good about it!"

Although the Braves were rated 7th of the ten KCAC teams by both the Media and KCAC Coaches in their pre-season polls, the Braves did tie for 4th place last year and Percy sees the Braves in the same position going into this year. "It's going to be tough—and it could go either way—but it'll just depend on how hard we want to work to improve in the KCAC."

ASSISTANT COACHES

Jim Grogan, a 1953 alumnus, begins his 12th year on the coaching staff. Grogan, who coaches receivers and tight-ends, was the defensive back coach for seven years and has also coached in the Ottawa U.S.D. 290 system. While attending OU he was a four-year letterman. His wife Doris and son Scott are also OU alumni.

Brad O'Dea, rejoined the coaching staff two years ago after coaching previously under Dick Peters and Ben Moor. He also coached for three years in Ottawa U.S.D. 290 and one year at Emporia State University. O'Dea, also an OU alumnus, coaches the offensive line.

Bill "Bo" Boucek, is the elderstatesman of the OU coaching staff, currently in his 32nd year. Boucek will once again control the defensive line coaching position. Boucek is also chairman of the Physical Education Department.

Warren Watson, begins his second year as defensive coordinator. Watson is a graduate of Fort Hays State University. He has been head football coach at Central Heights for the past eleven years and is currently the CH principal.

Mark Percy, begins his second year as the defensive backfield coach. He previously has coached at Allen County Community College and Washburn University.
