EDITORIAL NOTES

The National Council approved several changes in the Journal's format. Many of the changes were incorporated in the Fall edition. First, a review board has been established to read all manuscripts submitted for publication. Members of the board are Dr. Michael Bartanen, Dr. Terry Cole, Dr. Leanne Wolff, and Dr. Don Swanson. Board members will conduct a blind review to approve or reject each article. Any article to be considered must be submitted in triplicate with the author's name and instutional affiliation on one title page, to Dr. Anthony B. Schroeder, Editor. The APA style should be used for all manuscripts submitted.

The Forensic now accepts advertisements. Institutions wishing to advertise their undergraduate and graduate programs should submit camera ready copy to the editor of the Forensic. The cost is \$25.00 for a quarter page, \$50.00 for a half page, and \$100 for a full page. Hopefully textbook Publishers will also advertise in the Forensic.

The National Council approved a subscription rate change. Currently PKD alumni and non-members are paying \$7.50 for one year and \$18.00 for three years. The new price for PKD alumni and non-members is \$12.50 for one year and \$30.00 for three years.

The 1984 Summer edition of the Forensic will feature the results of the Province Tournaments. The Fall, Winter, and Spring editions of the Forensic will feature on a regular basis articles. President's Note, Pi Kappa Delta Who's Who, the Pi Kappa Delta Forum, and Chapter News and Notes. The Forum is designed for short statements to the forensic community, or for reactions to articles published in previous editions. Chapter News and Notes is designed for individual chapters to let others know about their accomplishments and projects. I would like to see at least one chapter from each Province included in each edition.

Bob E. Derryberry Governor, Province of Missouri



Let's Save N.D.T. Debate

The King is dead! Long live the king!

In the 1960's and throughout most of the 1970's, N.D.T. debate was King. A King that motormouthed and assailed all comers with file boxes. A King whose political corruption rivaled any monarch in history. A King whose magistrates made sure the right judges judged the "out of district" teams against "in District" teams in crucial rounds, a King so exhaulted that somehow a judge well trained in rhetoric and argumentation became inferior if he or she could not keep up with the motor-mouth. Then why should I want to save such a King?

Well, on second thought, maybe it isn't the King but the Kingdom that I'm concerned with. Policy debate is a kingdom worth saving. When debaters are not required to solve a problem, i.e., debate a plan, they are less likely to learn causeeffect reasoning, significancy thresholds, solvency probabilities and comparative advantage/disadvantage analysis. I knew a man, who would often say, "It's a good day if people don't foul it up." N.- D.T. debate was a good kingdom until people "fouled it up."

We are the people who fouled it up; we the teachers and judges of this win oriented activity. We who tell ourselves how over worked and underpaid we are and that we are in this profession for idealistic reasons. We did it! We did it by giving debaters the big "W" on the ballot who motor-mouthed evidence so rapidly that the only way we could evaluate it is to call for it and read it ourselves. We did this while all the time professing that we abhored this style of debate. To have saved N.D.T. debate all we would have to have done was to have told these motormouthers, "I can't understand a word you are saying! You lose!" But, we have to have done it. When I did it alone-suddenly I was assigned to judge inexperienced teams at big N.D.T. tournaments, and no longer was I assigned to judge elimination rounds. We killed our King by not rewarding delivery, analysis, humor, and good evidence. We killed our King, N.D.T., debate. Let's save our Kingdom, policy debate.
