The Treasurer's report was given by Mr. Bundy after which the current bills were audited, approved, and allowed.

Mr. Lister reported an offer of \$2400.00 for the eighty acre Saffer farm in Lyons County. Mr. Lister was authorized to make the sale either for cash or for cash and mortgage note for balance and the Vice President and Secretary of the Board were authorized to execute and deliver a deed for the West $\frac{1}{2}$ S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 32, Township 17, Range 13.

Mr. Lister was authorized to grant a right of way for construction of a power line to the Cooperative Power and Light Co. Inc. of Iola, Kansas dated Jan. 6, 1945. On Litner Jann on Allen Co. Kans.

After discussion of the annuity of Mrs. Maud Collingswood of Plains, Kansas, it was the opinion of the committee that President Martin should handle the case.

Upon the recommendation of Dr. Martin by a motion made by E. Lister, seconded by C. W. Hegberg, Mr. Wm. Gerhardt of Wichita, Kansas, was appointed a member of the Commission on Institutions of the Kansas Baptist State Convention. Mr. Gerhardt and Dr. Martin are to be the members of the Commission representing Ottawa University.

It was voted that \$225.00 be allowed to purchase some laboratory equipment for the Department of Education from Mr. and Mrs. Adrian Tieleman, the present owners of said equipment.

After discussion of the question of increasing the student's tuition, it was the concensus that Dr. Martin should investigate and report his findings of what other schools were charging, such report to be a guide for our future action.
