Dr. S. P. Fogdall Resigns

Dr. S. P. Fogdall, professor of history and government since 1931, has resigned to accept the pastorate of the Clarks Grove, Minn., Baptist church.

The going of Dr. Fogdall, one of the most popular and efficient instructors Ottawa has ever had, is a blow to the administration and to the students. President Martin was very much disappointed over the resignation, believing him to be one of the most able and valuable members of the staff.

The community to which Dr.

Fogdall is going was founded by Danes, and since he was born in Denmark, he will have much in common with the people of his new pastorate. He has been in the pulpit of the Clarks Grove church many times and has been repeatedly asked to take the pastorate.

Before coming to Ottawa, Dr. Fogdall was a professor of history in Des Moines University and in Penn College in Iowa.

His son Virgil graduated from Ottawa in 1932 and his son Gordon is at present a junior in the university.
