to prevent a situation similar to that which occurred in the Central Missouri State-William Jewell debate. The first affirmative speaker presented her entire speech only to learn at the conclusion that the negative had not heard a word past the opening statement.

3) Consider having an audience to offset the lack of feedback from the judge or members of the other team.

4) If the viewing screen is large enough, use three overhead projectors simultaneously rather than two. The reason is probably obvious. It is rather difficult to record legibly all aspects of the debate within the limited writing space of the machines.

Thus the telelecture system is a tool that presents evidence of assisting debaters in

reaching the proposition and in providing an avenue for meaningful inter-school debates. It is workable, most certainly feasible, and the unique advantages it offers have been demonstrated for those interested in increasing the scope of their forensic program. The use of overhead projectors seems to be a decided addition to the system. Mr. William Van Wormer, Director of Instructional Media for KCRCHE, aptly summarizes our thoughts on the use of the telelecture system when he states, "The value of the project is that people are talking together who've never talked before . . ."⁹

From the beautiful mountains of Arizona to the lure of the Texas Astroworld, it has been the pleasure of this editor to sit with the National Council in the preparation of two National Conventions. In both the summer meetings of 1968 and 1970, it was an impressive experience to watch Ted Karl and then Francis Short lead members of our National Council in exhaustive preparations for the Tempe and Houston Conventions. Student delegates and sponsors have selected their national leaders well and we may confidently expect they will continue to do so — in Houston next March and in the years ahead.

The use of a newsletter by Governors has produced favorable results and we recommend that the eleven newly elected Governors try this method in their Provinces. John Baird circulated a newsletter yearly in the Province of the Pacific. John Mendiola of Akron University published an attractive daily newsletter when his school hosted the Province of the Lakes last March. Ted Karl and Les Lawrence, members of the National Council, report that their Province of the Northwest plans to start a newsletter. Another suggestion came out of the recent Council meeting in Houston — that each Governor circulate a directory of schools in his Province.

Larry Norton is sending up distress signals from Peoria. Many chapters are failing to send in the annual chapter report. In fact, he reported in Houston that over half of our 258 chapters failed to do so last November. To review our PKD procedure for new and old sponsors alike, each chapter received its annual chapter report form in October. **IT'S ON YOUR DESK NOW SPONSORS!** Fill it out and return it to Larry Norton by November 15. Then the chapter directory is prepared from these reports and published in the January issue of *The FORENSIC*. A healthy chapter is a responsive chapter, one which proudly lists its student president as well as its faculty sponsor.

Finally, please send to President Short the names of recently deceased Pi Kappa Deltans. A remembrance period for them will be observed in the first business meeting at the Houston Convention.
