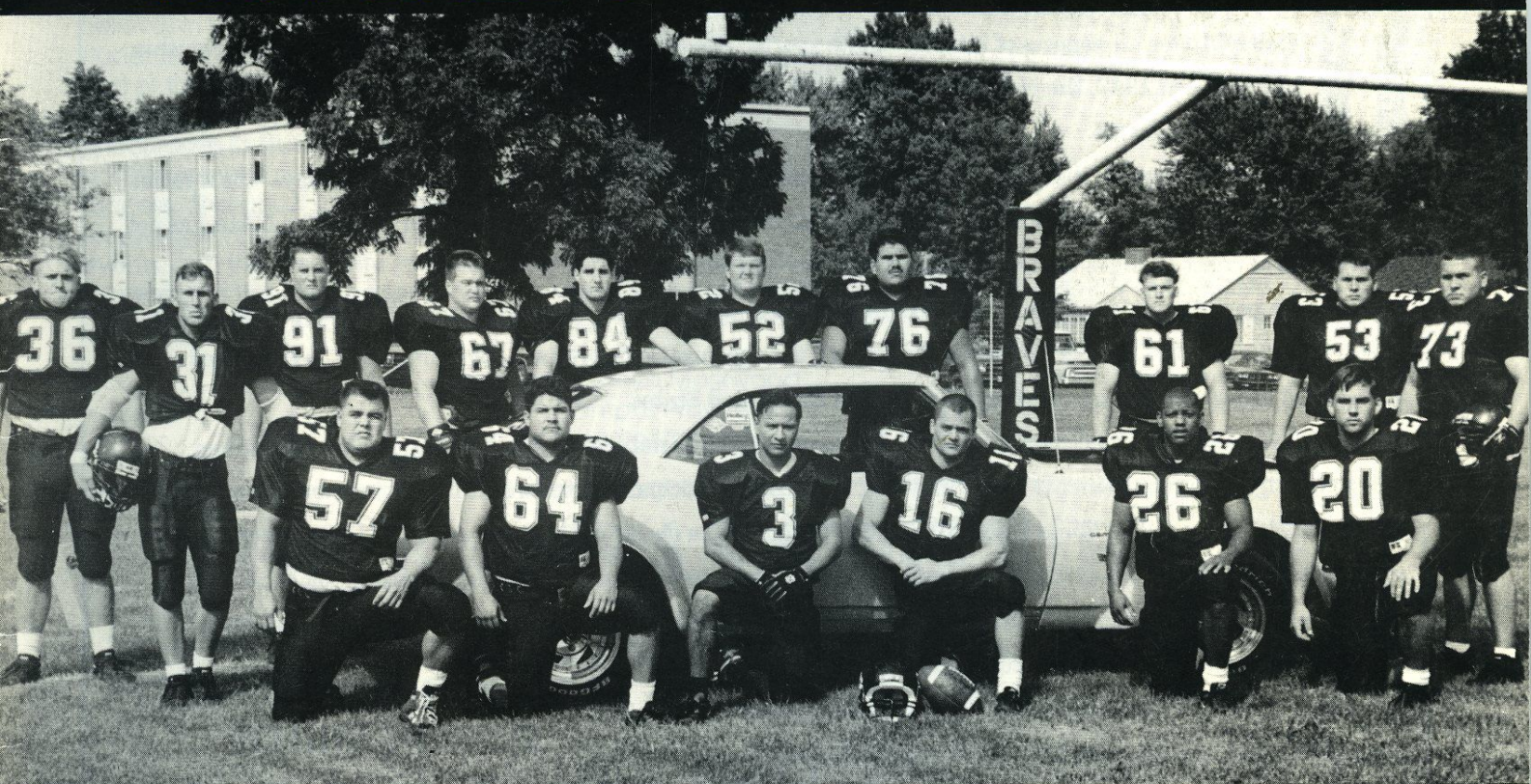
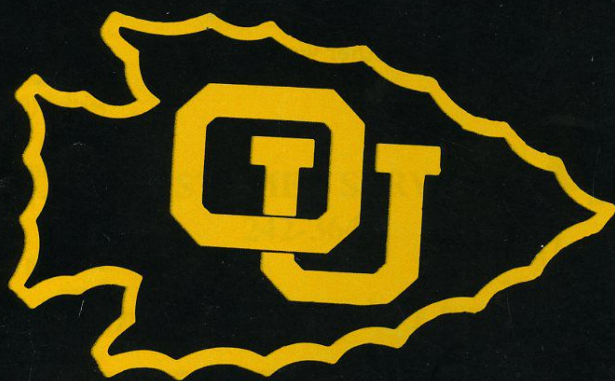

The NAIA – Providing Balanced Athletics Programs for More Than 80,000 Student-Athletes



OVERVIEW

Throughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports. Since its introduction of intercollegiate championship basketball in 1937, the NAIA has maintained the highest standards while administering first-rate athletics programs.

Time and time again, the NAIA has stepped forward to address the important issues of the day — be it racial integration in the '40s and '50s or establishing the first women's championship program in 1980. The NAIA has not been afraid to enact changes while others have watched and waited.

In the past decade, presidents of the NAIA colleges and universities have assumed a position of responsible leadership. In fact, the NAIA's Council of Presidents, the organization's primary governing body, is comprised of 32 college and university presidents from all regions of the United States.

With its major emphasis on educational development, it was natural for the NAIA to further strengthen academic eligibility requirements in the mid-'80s. All NAIA participating student-athletes must maintain a certain grade-point-average (GPA) while accumulating credit hours for a declared academic degree. Unlike other associations, NAIA student-athlete academic eligibility is monitored on a semester-by-semester basis.

The All-America Scholar-Athlete program, a long-standing NAIA tradition, recognizes junior and senior student-athletes with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale). This past year, nearly 600 NAIA student-athletes were so honored, representing 220 member institutions.

Since 1937, the NAIA has administered athletics programs and championships in proper balance with the overall collegiate educational experience. Serving higher education in this manner is a responsibility the NAIA does not take lightly. It is a relationship built on confidence and trust — a relationship strengthened year after year. The future of 80,000 young people is too important to handle any other way.

HISTORY

From Equal Opportunity to the Highest Academic Standards – A History of Leadership

- 1937 National Small College Basketball Tournament staged at Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, Missouri (first NAIA championship)
- 1938 Basketball tournament expands to 32 teams
- 1940 National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB) formed; first convention held
- 1944 No basketball tournament staged (World War II)
- 1948 Black student-athletes participate in NAIB basketball tournament
- 1952 NAIB adopts new moniker — National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and introduces championships for golf, tennis, and outdoor track and field
- 1953 Predominantly black institutions are admitted into full membership
- 1956 Baseball, cross country, football, and swimming and diving championships added
- 1957 NAIA headquarters moves from the campus of George Pepperdine College in Los Angeles to Kansas City, Missouri
- 1958 Championships added for wrestling ('58), soccer ('59), *bowling ('62),
- 1969 *gymnastics ('64), indoor track and field ('66) and *volleyball ('69) —
(* no longer sponsored)
- 1970 Football splits into two divisions
- 1976 Basketball championship moves to Kemper Arena in Kansas City after 38 years in Municipal Auditorium
- 1980 NAIA becomes first national association to sponsor women's championships – basketball, cross country, *gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, and volleyball championships for women added — (*no longer sponsored)

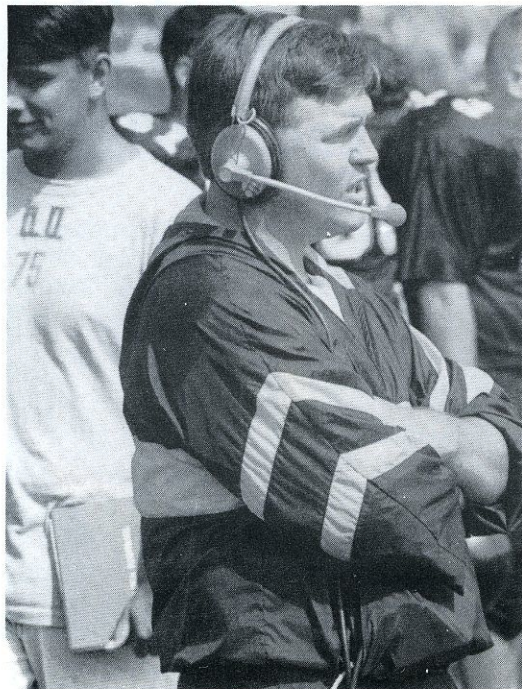

Previously, he was defensive coordinator at Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa, where he also served as recruiting coordinator.

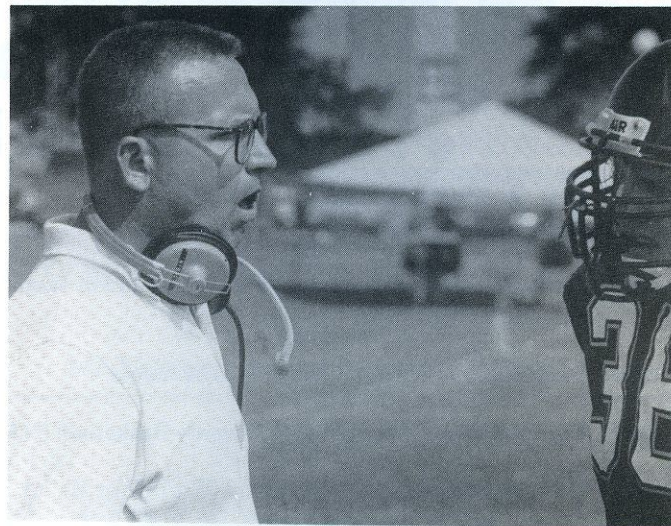
OU FOOTBALL 1994 SEASON OUTLOOK

With nine offensive and defensive starters returning for the 1994 football season, the Braves outlook appears very promising.

Offensively the Braves will return Desmond "Stick" Robinson who in 1993 set a new single season rushing record at OU with 1,504 yards. Robinson was named to the All-Conference first team along with grabbing All-American honors. The 1993 campaign saw Robinson average seven yards per carry and score 16 touchdowns. He also led the league in scoring with 102 points. The Braves will also return quarterback Noah Mann and fullback Ernest Wash. Mann threw for over 1,000 yards and seven touchdowns. Wash rushed for nearly 500 yards and three TD's. The entire starting offensive line will return for 1994 to open holes and provide protection.

Defensively, the Braves return their leading tackler and All-Conference linebacker, Kevin Linsner, who grabbed 64 solo tackles and 24 assists. Also anchoring the defense will be linebacker Lance Bell, and defensive backs Clint Guth and Mark Casey. The Braves will be looking to fill the shoes of All-American defensive end Matt Cline who graduated in 1994.

Picked by the coaches and media as one of the top teams in the KCAC, the Braves hope to capture a conference crown in 1994 and make a bid at the National playoffs in November.
