The NAIA – Providing Balanced Athletics Programs for More Than 80,000 Student-Athletes



OVERVIEW

Throughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports. Since its introduction of intercollegiate championship basketball in 1937, the NAIA has maintained the highest standards while administering first-rate athletics programs.

Time and time again, the NAIA has stepped forward to address the important issues of the day — be it racial integration in the '40s and '50s or establishing the first women's championship program in 1980. The NAIA has not been afraid to enact changes while others have watched and waited.

In the past decade, presidents of the NAIA colleges and universities have assumed a position of responsible leadership. In fact, the NAIA's Council of Presidents, the organization's primary governing body, is comprised of 32 college and university presidents from all regions of the United States.

With its major emphasis on educational development, it was natural for the NAIA to further strengthen academic eligibility requirements in the mid-'80s. All NAIA participating student athletes must maintain a certain grade-point-average (GPA) while accumulating credit hours for a declared academic degree. Unlike other associations, NAIA student-athlete academic eligibility is monitored on a semester-by-semester basis.

The All-America Scholar-Athlete program, a long-standing NAIA tradition, recognizes junior and senior student-athletes with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale). This past year, nearly 600 NAIA student-athletes were so honored, representing 220 member institutions.

Since 1937, the NAIA has administered athletics programs and championships in proper balance with the overall collegiate educational experience. Serving higher education in this manner is a responsibility the NAIA does not take lightly. It is a relationship built on confidence and trust — a relationship strengthened year after year. The future of 80,000 young people is too important to handle any other way.

HISTORY

From Equal Opportunity to the Highest Academic Standards – A History of Leadership

- 1937 National Small College Basketball Tournament staged at Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, Missouri (first NAIA championship)
- 1938 Basketball tournament expands to 32 teams
- 1940 National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB) formed; first convention held
- 1944 No basketball tournament staged (World War II)
- 1948 Black student-athletes participate in NAIB basketball tournament
- 1952 NAIB adopts new moniker — National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and introduces championships for golf, tennis, and outdoor track and field
- 1953 Predominantly black institutions are admitted into full membership
- 1956 Baseball, cross country, football, and swimming and diving championships added
- 1957 NAIA headquarters moves from the campus of George Pepperdine College in Los Angeles to Kansas City, Missouri
- 1958 Championships added for wrestling ('58), soccer ('59), *bowling ('62),
- 1969 *gymnastics ('64), indoor track and field ('66) and *volleyball ('69) — (*no longer sponsored)
- 1970 Football splits into two divisions
- 1976 Basketball championship moves to Kemper Arena in Kansas City after 38 years in Municipal Auditorium
- 1980 NAIA becomes first national association to sponsor women's championships – basketball, cross country, *gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, and volleyball championships for women added — (*no longer sponsored)

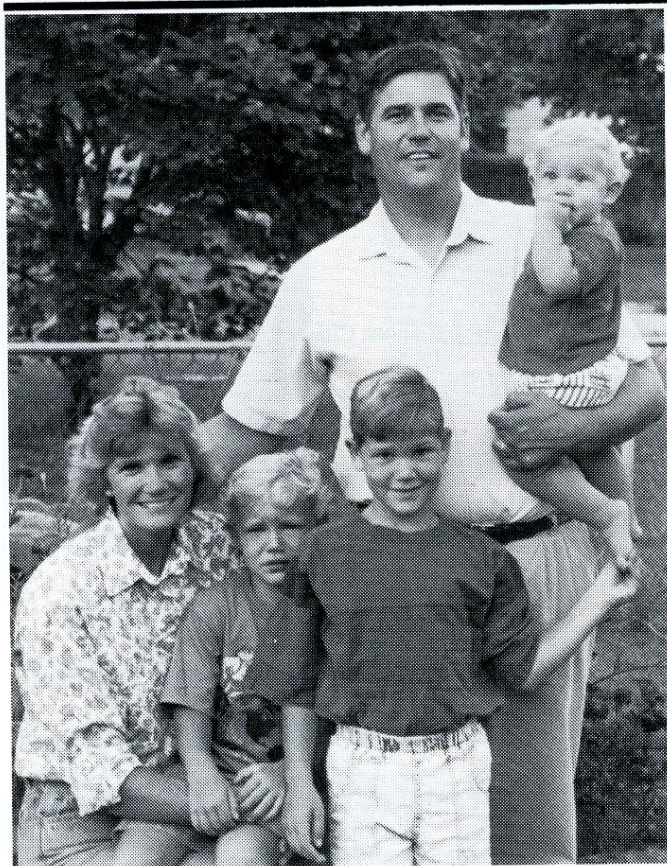

COACH DAVE DALLAS

Coach Dallas is entering his fourth year as head football coach at Ottawa University. Last Season he compiled a conference record of 5-4 and 5-5 overall. Coach Dallas came to the University in 1989. Previously, he was defensive coordinator at Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa, where he also served as recruiting coordinator.

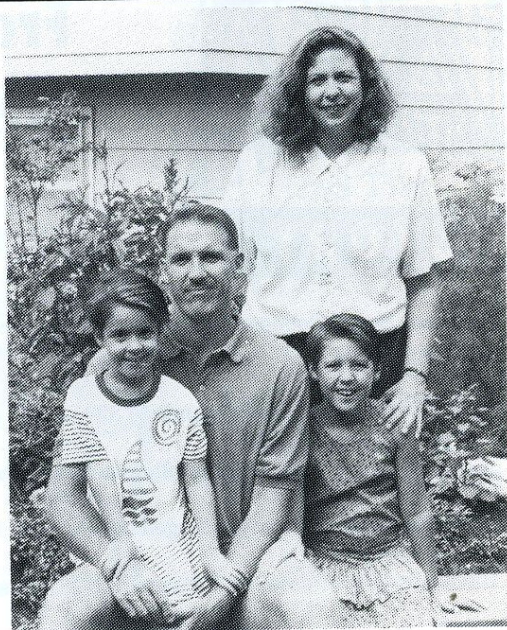
OU FOOTBALL 1992 OUTLOOK

Ottawa University will return 36 lettermen for the 1992 season including eight offensive starters and 11 defensive starters.

"Defensively we will be very strong," said fourth year head coach Dave Dallas. "On the offensive side we have some key spots to fill and hopefully some kids will step up and fill some big shoes."

Two of the key offensive losses were receivers. All-Conference and All-District tight-end Matt Weidl and All-Conference wide-receiver Freddie King both graduated and leave sizable holes in the Braves passing game. Dallas will call on wide-receiver Jess Pittman and junior tight-end Matt Lloyd to make up the absence of King and Weidl. Pittman was an All-Conference honorable mention selection last year. The Braves will return All-Conference and All District quarterback Barry Bronk for his senior season. Last year Bronk threw for over 1,700 yards with 18 touchdowns and completed better than 52% of his passes. Two key offensive linemen also return for their senior campaign, Russ Cubblison and Milt Ruble. Both were All-Conference selections last year. Garnering much of the running game will be seniors Steve Sartin and Troy Lewis.

Defensively Dallas will have two time All-Conference defensive-end Matt Cline back for his junior year, along with senior linebacker Clint Ketcher and senior defensive back Darrell Allen who were both All-Conference honorable mention selections last year. Other defensive standouts to look for include senior defensive end Trey Zepada, and senior defensive linemen Tim Taylor and Matt Thomsen.
