



THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE




Mike Custer, Senior

During the past couple of years around the OU soccer scene, one name has become almost synonymous with the word "goal" - Custer. The 1978 campaign saw Custer break the OU single season scoring mark of 25 goals set in 1968 by Mirko Grgas. Custer, known throughout the community as "Super Munchkin", found the back of the net 28 times. Custer also moved into the number

two slot on the Braves' career scoring list with 50. He trails only Grgas, a former All-American, who had 88. Custer has professional soccer ambitions and works year round to stay sharp. He works in soccer camps throughout, not only the Midwest, but Eastern United States and England. Custer, an All-Midwest selection, has been looked at by professional scouts and will have to continue to display the skills and knowledge that have brought him to the brink of the professional soccer ranks.
