

# Myers Library to Sponsor Contest

In connection with National Library Week, April 3-9, Myers Library is holding a student book collection contest for the best student book collection submitted in open competition.

## Rules of the Contest

1. The contest is open to all students regularly enrolled at Ottawa University.
2. Books must be owned by the student and must have been collected by him.
3. Regardless of the size of a contestant's total library or collection, entries will be limited to a selection of not less than 20, nor more than 50, books.
4. Each entry will be judged for content and quality of the collection according to the subject of interest. (See item No. 8.) Size of the collection, monetary value of the books, and age of the books will not be considered of primary importance.

5. Each contestant will submit a bibliography of his collection with a statement, not over 400 words, of his purpose in making the collection, including some reference to how and under what circumstances the collection was made. To be submitted to H. Walthall, librarian, not later than March 28, 1960.
6. After preliminary judging, which will be made on the basis of the bibliographies, finalists will be asked to bring their collections of books to the library for final judging.
7. After the judges' final decision has been announced, the prize-winners' collections may be exhibited in the library.
8. Books should be in one of the following areas; students may enter one or more areas separately:
  1. Natural Science
  2. Health and Physical Education
  3. Education and Psychology
  4. Social Sciences
  5. Language and Communications
  6. Fine Arts
  7. Religion and Philosophy
  8. General
9. No distinction will be made between paper backs or hard bound books. Text-books will not be acceptable.
10. Two prizes of \$10.00 each will be given in the following divisions:  
Freshman-Sophomore  
Junior-Senior

Judges for the contest will be Miss Lulu Brown, Associate Professor of English Emeritus, and Miss Nelle Barnaby, librarian at Carnegie Free Library in Ottawa. For further information, see Mr. Walthall.
