SUMMER IS HERE: SO LET'S WEED THE LIBRARY'S REFERENCE COLLECTION!!

Weeding the Myers Library reference collection has been long overdue. This summer, time has been spent, with help from each Academic Department, to weed sections of the library's reference collection, since books in the collection have not been weeded for at least 15 years, although surprisingly enough, I found books in the collection that hailed from the early 20th century.

Weeding the reference collection is very much like weeding a patch in the garden. When you weed your garden, you want to make sure that you have pulled out all the plants that are choking up all your most beautiful plants and flowers; and

that way, you have a prized garden. Similarly, it is good to get rid of old and antiquated reference books, especially when they are not being used by students or by faculty, or when they

need to be replaced by newer books or in our case, good online reference resources that would be used a great deal more than the oldest copies of our reference books would be used.

Once books have been weeded, they are loaded onto the library's book elevator and sent to down

to technical services, where the books are then removed from the library catalog. Books that are too old to sell at on-going library book sale, are boxed and sent out with the old newspapers to be recycled.

The Hard-copy Reference books that remain in the collection are collaborative choice of college librarians and aching faculty at the

teaching faculty at the Campus; and are sure to be utilized by Campus students and faculty, in their academic pursuits.

Credo Reference database
is the library's newest acquisition, and library users
can access this database
through the Myers Library
Online Database Page in
the Portal. This resource
contains more than 400

new reference titles, with e -additions being made monthly. This reference tool allows users to access a variety of e-biographies, encyclopedias and dictionaries on a wealth of subjects from well-known academic publishers of the ilk of ABC-Clio, Greenwood, Macmillan, and Sage, .

Credo Reference has two

useful features that can be utilized for reference research, that was not been available before through Oxford Reference Online, and these are: Image Search and Concept Search. Image search provides users with e-videos which can be searched in the Credo Reference Database, while Concept Search

This resource also comes with Gadgets that allow users to look up information by image, person, definition and conversations of area, speed, distance, weight and fuel consumption etc. can also be made as needed during a search.
