

KTJO Expands Programming

KTJO, Ottawa University's campus radio station has opened its new season this year with an all-time high in staff members. Forty-three people now work actively for the station. In Station Manager Curt Hildreth's words, "Not all of these people are heard on the air though. Many work behind the scenes as engineers, librarians and at other jobs that never come to public notice."

KTJO is run by its manager, Curt Hildreth, under the direction of the Board of Governors consisting of Randy Thompson, Loncher, Curt Hildreth

and Dr. Twedt. Curt explained that, "the station has two primary goals in its association with the university. It serves as a learning experience for those who work on the station and it provides various educational material to the students that is not found within other programs on campus."

KTJO broadcasts on a frequency of 660 AM and 88.1 FM from 4 - 12 p.m. Sundays through Thursdays, from 4 p.m. to 2 a.m. on Fridays, and from 2 p.m. to 2 a.m. on Saturdays. This year the station is embarking on a new goal to col-

lege radio. It is their hope to change KTJO - FM into a stereo station. Plans for the change-over have already been submitted to the Federal Communications Commission. In speaking of the proposed change to stereo, Curt said, "It will be a valuable asset to the station and to the school."
