Dear Ms. Kelly:

I am sending this letter to follow up our telephone conversation of November 8, 1983. This is in reference to your letter 8920-RMK of October 21, 1983 to Mr. Nathan McGurk, Ottawa University, Ottawa, Kansas 66067.

Ottawa University will plan to expand our FM educational station known as KTJO of Ottawa University, Ottawa, Kansas to a 100 watt transmitter sometime around July 1, 1984. We therefore would like to continue broadcasting on our 10 watt station, 88.1 frequency until that time. We are presently in the process of obtaining a 100 watt transmitter and hope to complete negotiations for that within the next four months. It will then take some time to move the transmitter and tower to the university. It is necessary for us to obtain this through donations and costs which are much reduced from normal new equipment. Prior to the time of completing our installation we will then seek renewal for a license which will be consistent with the new transmitter output.

Thank you for your information and understanding of Ottawa University's broadcasting situation at this time. We will keep you informed as we proceed with our plans or find it necessary to make changes.
