Meeting of the Faculty Wives
held at the home of Mrs. R. M.
Godlove, May 10th, 1939. Nine members
were present.

The Nominating Committee
presented the name of Mrs. A. B.
Martin as President for the ensuing
year. When put to a vote Mrs.
Martin was unanimously elected.
After some discussion it was
decided to add a Secretary-Treasurer
and Mrs. S. M. Pady was duly elected.

Treasurer's report was presented
and showed 45⁰⁰ in arrears.

Mrs. MacAulley sent in the meeting
a suggestion for teas to be given
during the coming school year, a
silver tea in the fall for the mothers
of students, and a tea in the spring
for the senior girls. This suggestion
was discussed at length. It was
felt that because so ^{few} of the mothers
live in or near Ottawa the fall
tea would not fulfil its purpose.
Therefore, at the suggestion of Mrs.
Martin it was moved by Mrs. Pady
and seconded by Mrs. Ruff that
the Faculty Women and Faculty
Wives, jointly, give a fall tea for
the freshmen girls, and a spring tea
for the senior girls.

Mrs. Pady was appointed

chairman of a committee to confer with Mr. R. B. Bundy regarding suggestions to be built in the kitchen at Sany Jones Hall. Mrs. W. T. Gell was selected as the other member of the committee.

The matter of a yearly fee was decided upon as a more satisfactory way of providing money for the club's incidental expenses than by the present method of 5⁴ per month. The sum of \$50⁰⁰ per year was a favored suggestion but the final decision was left for the next president to bring before the members at the first meeting in the fall.

Mrs. Bundy and Mrs. Pedy were

appointed by Mrs. Martin to call the members and ask if and when they would like to open their homes for the club meetings, a report to be made at the next meeting.

After discussing the matter at length it was generally felt that we should have a program of not too strenuous a nature at each meeting, and it was thereon moved by Mrs. Conrad and seconded by Mrs. Keiff that the two hostesses in charge of a meeting be responsible for the program, either by bringing in outside talent or by members of the club. The hostesses will also provide the light refreshments.

It was moved by Mrs. Swamp and seconded by Mrs. Godwin that we send a gift to Mrs. Weaver when her baby arrives, each member to pay 25¢. The committee to take care of the purchase is Mrs. Kerr, Mrs. Swamp, Mrs. Conrad.

Mrs. Martin served refreshments of cookies, nutbread and iced tea before the business meeting.
