

MEET YOUR CANDIDATES

For your information and evaluation, the KEY is presenting a short background review of our three candidates for Office. Their names will be officially placed before the delegates at the business meeting tonight at 8:30 p.m.

ROSELYN FREEDMAN--A 15-year faculty member and Pi Kappa Delta Chapter Sponsor at Morris Harvey College, Roz seeks the office of the Presidency after a varied background in our fraternity. She has held all Province of the Lakes offices, hosted and directed provincial tournaments, and has served two years as Associate Editor of The Forensic. On the national level, Roz has served on tournament contest committees and has been a member of the National Council since 1977. Roz holds a B.A. in English and Speech from Morris Harvey, an M.F.A. from Ohio University, and is a doctoral candidate at the University of Michigan in Rhetoric/Speech. She has published poetry as well as two professional articles.

ROGER HUFFORD--Dr. Hufford is professor of Speech and director of forensics at Clarion State College, Clarion, PA. Also a member of Pi Kappa Delta since his undergraduate days, Dr. Hufford holds the M.A. from both Illinois State University and Durham University, England. His doctorate is from Southern Illinois University. He has served Pi Kappa Delta in province offices, as a member of the national Resolutions Committee, and as chairman of the national Contest Committee, and as chairman of the national Contest Committee in cross-examination debate. This year he chairs the Contest Committee. Dr. Hufford was one of the participants invited to contribute to the AFA Sedalia Conference on Forensics as Communication and has pioneered experimental tournaments in forensics at Clarion. He was director of the 1969 NDT Tournament.

JACK STARR--Currently serving as Pi Kappa Delta Vice-President, Jack is forensics coach at the University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse. He has held all three Upper Mississippi provincial offices and has been a member of the National Council for four years. Besides his extensive experience with our fraternity, Jack has been active in the Wisconsin forensics organization. In 1969, he organized the Wisconsin Collegiate (cont'd., Col. 2)

Association and now serves as its permanent Executive-Secretary. Jack's professional interests are debate, theater, and oral interpretation. He holds degrees from Drake University, Northern Colorado, and the University of Minnesota. As an undergraduate, he became a Pi Kappa Delta member and consequently has many experiences as a participant in these conventions.

TRADITIONAL PKD FAMILY MEMBER

Dr. James N. Holm, Jr., is a third-generation Pi Kappa Deltan who takes great pride in the extensive participation his family enjoys in this forensics organization.

Dr. Holm, who is here with two of his students from Austin Peay State University, Clarksville, TN, is currently Secretary-Treasurer of Province 9 of Pi Kappa Delta.

Both Dr. Holm's mother and father, his two sisters, and even his grandfather, have been members of Pi Kappa Delta.

His father, James N. Holm, Sr., was both chairman of the Speech department and director of forensics at Kent State University (Iota Chapter) for about 40 years, while his mother was involved with the Iota Chapter at Kent State where she served as professor of speech.

His grandfather, James B. Holm, helped organize the chapter of Pi Kappa Delta at Mt. Union College (Mu Chapter), Alliance, Ohio. The Holm family is truly Pi Kappa Delta oriented.

As requested at the Student Meeting on Monday evening, here are the Amendments to the Pi Kappa Delta Constitution adopted in 1975 and 1977.

1973 Constitution

Amendments Approved

ARTICLE III - Admission of Members

"Eligibility to membership in this fraternity shall be determined as follows".

"Eligibility to active membership in this fraternity shall be determined as follows." (Adopted 1975)

ARTICLE III - Admission of Members

"2. Recognition. All institutions maintaining Local Chapters of Pi Kappa Delta and all other institutions of collegiate rank granting a four year degree shall be recognized institutions, provided the institution is accredited by its appropriate regional accrediting association."

"Chapters of Pi Kappa Delta may be established in institutions of collegiate rank offering course work beyond the Associate of Arts level, provided the institution is accredited by its appropriate regional accrediting association." (Adopted 1975)

ARTICLE IV - Division of Membership

Division C - Degrees

1. Degree of Fraternity.

"(a) Order of Individual Speaking. The candidate shall have represented his college in six rounds at recognized intercollegiate contests in events approved by the National Convention; or have presented six non-classroom speeches; or a combination of six contest rounds and nonclassroom speeches."

"(a) Order of Individual Speaking. The candidate shall have represented his college in six rounds at recognized intercollegiate contests; or shall be certified by his chapter sponsor as having presented six non-classroom speeches of significance and merit; or a combination of six contest rounds and nonclassroom speeches." (Adopted 1975)

ARTICLE V - Organization

Division A - The Local Chapter

"6. Fees. The initiation fee of all members of all classes shall be ten dollars payable upon application for membership."

"6. Fees. The initiation fee of all members of all classes, payable upon application for membership, shall be set by the National Council with majority approval by the National Convention." (Approved 1975)

"7. Officers. Each chapter shall have a faculty sponsor who shall be recognized as the sponsor by the college or university where the Local Chapter is chartered. Refusal to appoint a faculty sponsor shall be grounds for possible revocation or probation of the chapter."

Alumni Chapters are exempt from the provision requiring a faculty sponsor. Refusal to appoint a faculty sponsor shall be grounds for possible revocation or probation of the chapter." (Adopted 1975)

"10. Expulsion. The Local Chapter shall have the power to expel any member by at least a four-fifths affirmative vote. Notice of such expulsion shall be sent to the National Secretary-Treasurer on the official form, accompanied by the key of the member expelled. An expelled member may be readmitted to membership by a unanimous vote of the Local Chapter."

"10. Expulsion. The Local Chapter shall have the power to expel any member by at least a four-fifths affirmative vote of its total membership. Notice of such expulsion shall be sent to the National Secretary-Treasurer on the official form, accompanied by the key of the member expelled. An expelled member may be readmitted to membership by a unanimous vote of the total active membership of the Local Chapter." (Adopted 1977)

"12. Duties."

"12. Duties of the Undergraduate Chapters." (Adopted 1977)

"13. Convention Attendance. Any chapter failing to have a delegate at the first National Convention after the granting of its charter, or any chapter failing to have a delegate at two consecutive National Conventions, shall be placed on probation. Such probationary status can be lifted only by action of a National Convention."

"13. Convention Attendance. All undergraduate chapters are required to attend the National Convention. Any chapter failing to have a delegate at the first National Convention following its installation shall be placed on probation. Any chapter accumulating two consecutive unexcused absences from attendance at the National Convention shall be placed on probation. Any chapter accumulating three consecutive unexcused absences

from attendance at the National Convention shall forfeit its charter. Probationary status can be lifted only by action of a National Convention." (Adopted 1977)

"13. (Added) Each Alumni Chapter shall provide itself with a local constitution, shall meet at least once a year, shall report changes in membership to the National Secretary-Treasurer, and shall send an annual report summarizing the chapter activities to the National Secretary-Treasurer." (Adopted 1977)

"16. Reaffiliation. Chapters which have lost their charters and wish to reaffiliate may do so by application through the regular petitioning process." (Added following #15; Adopted 1977)

ARTICLE V - Organization

Division C - The National Organization
 "6. National General Chapter. Members of the General Chapter shall pay to the National Secretary-Treasurer an initiation fee of \$10.00." (Adopted 1977)

"6. National General Chapter. Members of the General Chapter shall pay to the National Secretary-Treasurer the current initiation fee." (Adopted 1977)

"General Editing. Permission is requested to allow the incoming Constitutional Revision Committee to edit for clarification and for improvement of punctuation and syntax, providing no substantive changes be made in content of the document." (Adopted 1977)
