**BARTANEN, COLE, AND LITTLEFIELD ELECTED TO NATIONAL COUNCIL**

The membership of Pi Kappa Delta elected three candidates to serve on the National Council at the third and final business meeting, Friday evening. Michael Bartanen, Terry Cole, and Robert Littlefield were elected to a two year term of office on the National Council.

Michael Bartanen, Pacific Lutheran University was elected to his first term of office on the National Council. Bartanen has been involved with PKD since 1970. He served as Governor of the Province of the Northwest. Bartanen is a review editor for The FORENSIC of Pi Kappa Delta.

Terry W. Cole, Appalachian State University was elected to his third term of office on the National Council. Cole has been involved with PKD for thirteen years. He served as Governor of the Province of the Southeast. Cole is a review editor for The FORENSIC of Pi Kappa Delta.
